### Weekly Theme

Our weekly theme this week is 'Showing initiative! Initiative- The ability to propel life forward in purposeful directions

We can help children show more initiative by:

- Being on the sidelines to help facilitate children's learning.
- Encouraging children to get back on their feet after a fall – because you believe in them.
- Being a helpful guide as children identify challenges, reflect on their choices, arrive at decisions, adjust strategies and plan next steps. Listen and encourage.
- Being a role model. Show them how you get things done but don't do things for them that they can do for themselves.
- Encouraging them to find things out eg. about their topic work

### Book of the Week

Our book of the week this week is 'Wonder' by J Palacio and it is recommended by Miss Biddle.

Auggie wants to be an ordinary ten-year-old. He does ordinary things - eating ice cream, playing on his Xbox. He feels ordinary - inside. But ordinary kids don't make other ordinary kids run away screaming in playgrounds. Ordinary kids aren't stared at wherever they go.

### Our Learning

**Year 3:** In English this week we learnt how to write an action story with verbs and adjectives. They were about Gauls attacking Rome. We read it to year 4 and we all really enjoyed it!

In maths we have been finding the difference with cuisenaire and number lines. This week we are getting to know our coins and finding change from £5.

In topic we have been continuing to learn about the Romans. We have been researching the food they ate, the schools they went to, the toys they played with, the rags that the poor people wore and the shiny armour that the soldiers wore.

**Year 4:** This week in maths we have been learning about measurement and how to convert units of measure such as kilometres to metres and hours to minutes.

In literacy we have been learning subordinate clauses and attempting to add them to our writing.

Next week in literacy we will be consolidating our learning of fronted adverbials and prepositional phrases and applying them to our writing.

In maths we will be learning about statistics such as interpreting and presenting data.

**Look out for your invitation coming home this week from the yr 5 teachers, inviting you to meet find out more about the yr 5 residential trip for your children next year.**

**Year 5:** In literacy this week, we have started to write our stories based on evacuation. We have been focussing on connectives and prepositional phrases. Next week, we will be completing our stories and sharing them with Year 3.

In maths this week, we have been solving percentage problems. Next week, we will be doing calculations using roman numerals.

In topic this week, we have been using different sources to find out about different experiences of evacuation. Next week, we will begin to learn about the Blitz.

**Year 6:** The highlight of last week had to be Wednesday when we were visited by two aracari toucans, originally from the Amazon.

We used them as inspiration to produce a huge piece of artwork out of fence panels. Every member of the year group painted their own piece and when we placed them together, each class had an incredible painting of a toucan (*check out the blogs and website to see the pictures*).

In English, saw us complete our stories - we had created our own alternative endings to The Hound of the Baskervilles and written our own twist to the well-known classic. We have now started to look at non-fiction writing and are producing a non-chronological report about our fictional butterfly.

In maths we have been looking at the properties of circles and working on fractions.
