Our Learning

Year 3: In literacy this week we are going to be writing a letter about Goose Guards and what really happened in the real time of the book. Our purpose is to explain the Roman Empire. Later we will share our letters to Year 4.

In maths this week we are learning to recognise fractions as numbers and pictures. i.e. 9 eggs in a box of 12 is $\frac{3}{4}$.

Later this week we will be learning equivalent fractions.

In topic we are reflecting on what the Romans gave us: straight roads, wine, olive oil and gold coins. This is the Roman legacy. Later in the week we will be looking at special books in RE.

Year 4: This week in literacy we have been writing our newspaper reports on the terrible tragedy of the Titanic.

In maths, we have been adding and subtracting fractions and finding equivalent fractions.

Next week in literacy we will be creating a scrapbook based on the novel Kasper the Prince of Cats. In maths, we will learn about shapes and their properties.

Don't forget our Exit Point in Year 4 on Friday 27 May at 2.30pm, we are really looking forward to showing off all our hard work! ☺

Year 5: In literacy this week we have been learning about the features of newspaper reports. Next week we will be writing our own newspaper reports based on The Blitz.

In maths this week we have been solving addition and subtraction problems. Next week we will be investigating 2D shapes and learning how to draw and measure angles using a protractor.

In topic this week we have been publishing our evacuation stories, ready to produce a class book.

Letters are coming home to yr 5 parents to bring to your attention that we will be showing the children the film

'Goodbye Mr Tom' as this is PG rated, we ask you to let us know if you do not give permission for your child to watch it, thank you.

Year 6: SATs came and went. Simple as that. It was a tough few tests but I think we all gave it our best and in actual fact most of us admitted that the week was not as bad as we thought it would be. It has made us think that sometimes we can be a bit scared of the unknown but when it arrives, it's generally OK. This is something we can use over the next few weeks and months as we prepare for more new experiences such as Tile Barn and Secondary school.

In English, we have started a new class novel - Private Peaceful by Michael Morpurgo - and we're already hooked. It's written in a way that keeps us guessing; it's a bit like Holes in that way.

In maths we have begun our Virgin Money project that requires us to 'grow £5'! It is down to us to come up with a product that we can produce, market and eventually sell...for huge profit. Could one of us be the next Richard Branson?

Sports Day is next week and it is another thing to look forward to as each of us gets the chance to represent our house.

Special times indeed as we are also looking ahead to our end of year production with rehearsals soon getting underway. Let the show begin...
