Weekly Theme

Our weekly theme this week is **Growth Mindsets**. The term 'growth mindset' refers to a way of thinking, learning and taking on challenges. A person with a growth mindset is open to constructive criticism, takes feedback and uses it, takes on new challenges, pushes themselves outside of their comfort zone and shows resilience and perseverance.

A person with a growth mindset might say:

- 'I can grow my brain.'
- 'I love a challenge.'
- 'Mistakes help me learn.'
- 'I can't do it **yet...** but with hard work and perseverance I will be able to.'
- 'I love trying hard and new things.'
- 'I try new strategies and never give up.'
- 'Feedback helps me get better.'
- 'My hard work brings me success.'



Yesterday all the staff from both Calmore Infant School and Calmore Junior School undertook a whole day's training on Growth Mindset. We hope that introducing this across both schools will help to develop resilient, lifelong, successful learners.

Our Learning

Year 3 We are settled back into our school routine after our Christmas break. We have been working very hard on telling the time, our progress has been very impressive! In English last week we looked at poems and discussed exciting ways we could perform the poem aloud. We practised in small groups and performed in assembly on Friday. We sounded fantastic!

This week we are looking at our new topic "Staying Alive". We will be thinking about why we have and need bones and looking at skeletons of animals and how they are different to ours.

In English we are looking at Charlie and The Chocolate Factory and making our own chocolate place.

Next week in maths we will be comparing and ordering fractions. In English we will be writing a narrative about Charlie and The Chocolate Factory.

Please remember our Winter Warmer on Thursday; children can bring their pyjamas to change into & a teddy.

Year 4 This week, Year 4 have started lots of new learning: we have begun learning to write and use decimal numbers; we have started learning our story for this term (a retelling of the famous Wishing Tale, Aladdin) and have started our science topic (Light it Up!).

Next week, we will be moving on to addition (and measurement) in Maths, learning some key strategies to help us write our own wishing tales in English, thinking about the first few chapters of our class book, Aquila and beginning some exciting Science experiments. Maybe, by the end of next week, we will be able to tell you all about how to make a complete circuit!

Year 5 In literacy this week, we have started to learn about suspense stories by watching a short film called 'The Dream Giver.' Next week we will be starting to learn how to write our own suspense stories.

In maths this week, we have been developing our written methods of multiplication, using the grid method and short multiplication. We have also been solving multiplication problems. Next week, we will be developing our written methods of division.

This week, we have also been learning about what it means to have a growth mind-set and understanding more about what we can each do to make us even better learners.

On Friday afternoon, as part of our entry point, we will be tasting some foods from different countries.

A letter has already been sent home asking you to notify us of any food allergies.

Year 6 Happy new year! 2017 will be an exciting year with so much to look forward to: a trip to London, Tile Barn, end of year show plus the small matter of secondary school! Before all that there will be a lot of hard work but we're up for the challenge.

Last week we built our moving vehicles having designed them first on the computer using a program called 2D Primary. The finished 'machines' are excellent and were topped off with a body once again designed on computer then cut and folded to fit the frame. Apparently we will get the opportunity soon to design a program on the computer that will 'drive' and direct our cars. Exciting!

In English we have started a new book - Holes by Louis Sachar - and we're already gripped.

In maths we've been looking at area and perimeter and how we can calculate each for rectangles, triangles and even parallelograms.
