Weekly Theme

Our theme this week is Chinese New Year. Chinese New Year is the main Chinese festival of the year. As the Chinese use the Lunar calendar for their festivals the date of Chinese New Year changes from year to year. The date corresponds to the new moon (black moon) in either late January or February.

Traditionally celebrations last for fifteen days, ending on the date of the full moon. In China the public holiday lasts for three days and this is the biggest celebration of the year.

The Chinese calendar is different from that used in the United Kingdom. It is made up of a cycle of twelve years, each of them being named after an animal. This is very like our signs of the zodiac.

The Chinese New Year of the Rooster will be on 28 January 2017. It will be year 4715 on the Chinese Calendar.

into school by Friday 3 February.


Year 6 SATS Books

Our Learning

Year 3 This week in Maths we are learning how to count in tenths; recognise that tenths arise from dividing an object into 10 equal parts and in dividing one-digit numbers or quantities by 10.

In English, we are reading 'Gorilla' by Anthony Browne and writing about this story. We will be focusing on using a variety of sentence starters and conjunctions in our writing.

In Topic, we are learning about food chains, primary consumers and secondary consumers. We are going to be sorting plants and animals into food chains and looking at different animals and understanding the words omnivores, herbivores and carnivores.

Next week in Maths we will be using our knowledge of addition and subtraction and applying this knowledge to answer missing number problems.

Next week in English we will be reading 'Into the Forest' by Anthony Browne and writing about this story.

In Topic, we will understand how our body digests food. We will be explaining the journey of food by writing a story.

Thank you for attending the meeting about MyMaths on Monday, homework will be set under your child's username on Friday for them to complete on Wednesday. This is in addition to their times table homework in their homework books and their reading 5 times a week that is recorded in their reading logs.

Year 4 This week, we have finished off our Aladdin learning by writing our Hot Tasks. Mrs Welch and Miss Kynaston have read some fantastic stories, including magical penguins, gems with mysterious powers and some rather terrifying villains. We have also been using our investigative powers to explore the question '*Is it always, sometimes or never true that shapes with the same area will have different perimeters?*'. What do you think the answer was? Ask us what we found out and we may be able to tell you!

Next week, we will be revisiting multiplication in maths, and some of us may even start learning to use formal written method to help us solve more complex sums.

In English, we will be learning how to write persuasively, using the story of Aladdin to inspire us. We will also be beginning to use our Science learning to create special,

working lanterns in DT. Keep an eye on the blog for photos of work in progress!

Year 5 In literacy this week we have been continuing to write our suspense stories, focusing on vocabulary choice and short sentences to create suspense. Next week we will be designing machines to catch dreams. In maths this week we have been learning how to calculate the perimeter of different shapes. Next week we will be learning how to calculate the area of different shapes.

In geography this week we have begun a geographical enquiry about which is the best place for a family to live – Southampton or Paris. To do this, we have been looking at the physical and human geography of Paris and comparing it to Southampton. Next week, we will be off to Leeson House! We can't wait!

Next Wednesday 1 – 3 February is our Leeson House Residential – all payments should be with the office urgently before the trip.

Year 6 In English this week we continued to read Holes and the pieces of the story are starting to fit together nicely. We wrote character and setting descriptions as well as a letter home from Stanley to his mother. In maths we have been looking at angles and how it is possible to calculate missing angles in different shapes. It has been interesting as we've been investigating problems that require us to look for rules. Topic has been fascinating so far - we've learnt all about natural selection and how genetic mutations can lead to the evolution of entirely new species. We had to demonstrate this by being black or grey rats and playing tag...except the grey rats could only hop! We've also been using plasticine to build and adapt different creatures. Soon we will be using an animation app to create our very own evolution videos.
